Owl Mask

Oregon has 14 species of owls, many of which call the forest home. Owls don't build nests, but instead use tree cavities or other naturally occurring or human made structures. With this craft little ones can color their own owl mask and pretend to make their home in a forest tree.

You'll need:

- Owl mask template
- Crayons
- Craft stick or another handle
- Feathers
- Glue or tape

What to do:

1. Color in the owl.
2. Cut out the owl mask and holes for the eyes.
3. Glue or tape feather on.
4. Glue or tape a craft stick or other handle on the back.
5. Pretend to be an owl! Where will you make your home?
