





INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOLS, SALVAGE ANTHROPOLOGY, AND BASKETRY COLLECTIONS IN OREGON Examining collections from Ada Bradley Millican and Harwood Hall

Thursday, March 13 | 6:00 p.m.

One of the UO's earliest collections—almost 400 Native American works of art—was donated by U.S. Indian boarding school administrators. Indigenous historian and anthropologist David Lewis (member of the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde) and historian Vera Keller explore this collection in relation to the arts and crafts movement and the erasure of Indigenous culture.
