This summer, dozens of students are heading to museum field schools.

- **Indigenous Archaeology Field Methods** encourages students to learn collaborative and decolonizing archaeological principles in the field with the Amah Mutsun Tribal Band in northern California.
- **Applegate House Field School** gives students hands-on experience in archaeological field work and cultural resource management at a historic-era homestead.
- Students are also joining a two-week course intensive to organize, catalog, and analyze objects from the **Connley Caves Field School**.
