FLOWER DISSECTION



Flower name or description:

STAMEN: The male part of the flower is made up of two parts.		PISTIL! The female part of the flower is made up of three parts.
The anthers carry the pollen and are usually yellow.		The stigma is the sticky surface at the top that traps and holds pollen.
The filament is a thin, threadlike part that holds up the anther.		The style is a tube-like structure that holds up the stigma and leads down to the ovary.
PETALS are colored and shaped to attract pollinators. They protect the stamen and pistil.	SEPALS are the green parts at the bottom of the flower. They support and protect the flower.	Seeds form in the ovary .
